





**(A comparison of 2003 and 2002)**

☛ Total crimes reported **increased 12.1 %** (565 / 504)

☛ Violent crimes **increased 66.7 %** (10 / 6)

☛ Property crime **increased 8.1 %** (226 / 209)

Violent crimes include homicide, robbery, substantial or aggravated battery.

Property crimes include burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft.

√ Homicides **increased 200 %** (2 / 0)

√ Battery complaints **increased 66.7 %** (20 / 12)

√ Domestic Abuse complaints **increased 15.2 %** (38 / 33)

√ Burglary complaints **decreased 43.5%** (13 / 23)

√ Issuance of worthless check complaints **increased 231 %** (116 / 35)

√ While narcotic violation reports **decreased 40.5 %** (50 / 84), the passing of forged prescription complaints **increased 400 %** (5 / 1)

√ Theft complaints **increased 17%** (117 / 100)

√ Shoplifting complaints **increased 41.7 %** (34 / 24)

☛ The total of \$119,513 in stolen property is a **decrease of 5.6 %** over the total stolen property in 2002 (\$126,623)




